Target group	Investigators and prosecutors as well as other law enforcement staff specialised in THB, in particular in child trafficking, and/or responsible for the interviewing children.
Overall aim	To enhance the capacity of law enforcement officers in identifying child victims and in tackling child trafficking.
Learning strategy	The learning strategy is focused to support the participants to achieve the learning outcomes by following a learner-centred approach and interactive, participatory, practical and experiential principles in accordance with andragogic theory.
	The activity involves didactic learning through presentations by subject matter experts, experiential learning by group work as well as role play. Some preparatory assignments will be given to prepare for the activity.
Assessment strategy	In order to ensure the participants in this residential training activity will indeed meet the target group requirements, they are asked to complete the Participant Profile for pre-selection.
	The assessment strategy during the activity will be summative and with a focus on the learning process and not on a grading. Participants will be given the opportunity to write a "Reflective learning log" at the end of each day. This is to support participants' awareness and assessment of their own learning process.
	A second summative assessment will be conducted by the participants at the end of the activity in form of online feedback, which is a condition for receiving the Attendance Certificate. The outcomes will feed into a Trainers' Report, which will be used for quality enhancement of the activity, if reiterated.



Learning Outcomes	 Outline the challenges in detecting and preventing different forms of exploitation of children by traffickers; Distinguish specific requirements for dealing with international child trafficking cases in comparison to cases of adult exploitation; Identify potential victims of child trafficking by means of indicators and profiles; Explain the modi operandi of OCGs with regard to recruiting and exploiting children; Discuss the use of OSINT, social media and Internet for child trafficking and related instigations; Recognise the need for financial investigations related to child trafficking cases; Recognise the special modus operandi of online exploitation of children; Provide input to data collection at the EU level in order to enhance the combat of OCGs involved in THB; Apply child-specific interviewing techniques; Set up a plan for the investigation of child trafficking cases including follow-up support for child victims; Recognise the need of further evidence in addition to victim statements for successful prosecution of THB cases; Understand the specific problems and requirements of law enforcement in the context of exploitation of migrant children; Describe anti-trafficking measures at the EU level; Discuss THB victim protection schemes and other fundamental rights aspects.
