Overall Aim	Enhance the detection of false documents by better understanding of the design and security features of identity documents, and to combat forgery and illegal use of documents related to serious crime
Target group	Law enforcements practitioners tackling document fraud and experienced forensic experts and document examiners from border police, police forces and forensic laboratories and prosecutors (one third of participants)
Learning Strategy	 Independent Learning Phase (ILP) - pre-course assignments and pre-course study materials, provided by the trainers and uploaded on Learning Management System - 4,5 hours Contact Learning Phase (CLP) – interactive presentations, group work and discussions during the residential phase - 21 hours Post Course Phase (PCP) - post-course assignment and reading materials uploaded on Learning Management System - 4,5 hours
Assessment Strategy	The assessment strategy is designed to support learners' development towards the course learning outcomes, optimising opportunities for formative feedback. The grading is organised on PASS/FAIL criteria. In order to verify the effectiveness of the content understanding and the given assignments, at the end of the CLP the learners will be assessed by a pass / fail multiple-answer quiz. Further on, at the end of the CLP, the learners will be asked to design a case scenario that includes recommendations and good practices experienced prior and during the course. As well, this assessment will be a PASS / FAIL one.

Learning Outcomes	 After completion of the training activity, the participant will be able to: Recall the advantages of new technologies applicable to identify genuine travel documents and acquire knowledge on the design and security features of identity documents; Discuss the regulations related to the obligation to have identity cards in the Member States and specify the types of crimes committed by using identity cards; Describe the role of biometrics in travel and identity documents as well as at border crossing points; Recognise security features for identity cards/documents, their method of verification by the person authorised to verify personal data of individuals and their documents; Recognise different types of digital printing, digital output, be familiar with the state-of-the-art digital printing equipment; Recall modus operandi in relation to breeder documents; Outline key techniques in passengers profiling and impostor risk profiles at border control Exchange information via the available international channels, in particular Europol and Frontex.
