

CALL FOR EXPERTS

specialised in fighting drug trafficking offences to be involved in the activities planned in this field under Programme Component no. 1 - Strengthening the institutional capacity in the area of fighting organized crime, especially crimes facilitated by the Internet and environmental crimes (FOEC)

1. Presentation of the context of the selection of experts

The Prosecutor's Office attached to the High Court of Cassation and Justice (POHCCJ), as Programme Component Operator (PCO), in partnership with the National Institute of Magistracy (NIM) and the Directorate for the Investigation of Organised Crime and Terrorism Offences (DIICOT), as Component Partners, implements *Programme Component no 1 - Strengthening the institutional capacity in the area of fighting organized crime, especially crimes facilitated by the Internet and environmental crimes (FOEC)*, financed under the Public Security and Safety Programme 'Justice' of the second Swiss contribution to certain Member States of the European Union with a view to reducing economic and social disparities in the European Union.

The general objective of component 1 - FOEC is to strengthen the capacity of the Public Prosecutor's Office to effectively combat organised crime, in particular offences facilitated by the Internet, as well as environmental crime.

The results pursued through the implementation envisage:

- ➤ Increasing the training capacity of the National Institute of Magistracy, by developing new networks of trainers, eLearning infrastructure, knowledge and content.
- ➤ Increase the efficiency of investigations, professional skills and capacities within the Public Prosecution Service, including through the application of common inter-institutional standards on the conduct of criminal investigations.
- > Strengthen the capacity for international police and judicial cooperation.
- > Strengthen the technological capacities necessary to conduct criminal investigations.

The activities planned under the component include, inter alia, 5 training the trainers sessions and 36 training activities, training sessions on developing eLearning content, developing eLearning modules and video tutorials, as well as developing/reviewing integrated investigation methodologies in the areas of (i) combating cybercrime, (ii) combating money laundering, (iii) combating drug trafficking, (iv) combating trafficking in human beings and (v) combating environmental crime.

The target group of the activities of component 1 consists of prosecutors, judicial police officers, judges in criminal matters, specialists as well as other professionals involved in combating organised crime or supporting victims of such crimes (e.g. the National Agency for the Management of Seized Assets – ANABI, the National Agency against Trafficking in Persons – ANITP, NGOs specialised in supporting victims of drug trafficking and trafficking in human beings).

2. Objective of the selection procedure

The Prosecutor's Office attached to the High Court of Cassation and Justice and the National Institute of Magistracy announce the launch **for 2 expert's positions** (prosecutors, *criminal judges or other legal professionals*) with specialisation in the field of combating drug trafficking and related

areas, in order to participate in the implementation of the activities in the field concerned, planned under component no 1 FOEC, distributed as follows:

I. <u>2 experts</u> for participation to a preparatory workshop and 6 training sessions in the field of combating drug trafficking.

a) 1 preparatory workshop (Output 1/Activity 1.1 - Intervention 1.1.2)

The activity will aim to establish the framework for organising the training sessions (analysis of the current situation/identification of previous resources, establishment of the main topics addressed/learning objectives, their distribution at the level of the expert team, establishment of the agenda, plan for the development of training materials/questionnaire for checking the proposed topics/training needs/level of knowledge at the level of the target group (prosecutors, judicial police officers and judges), elaboration of a questionnaire for the evaluation of the training sessions, completion of the distribution of experts in the courses, etc.), as well as elaboration of recommendations on the format of the integrated methodology for conducting investigations in drug trafficking cases, respectively the topics for 2 eLearning modules and 2 video tutorials in the field.

Participants: 4 national experts and 2 international experts

b) 6 training sessions (Output 2/Activity 2.1 - Intervention 2.1.1)

The seminars will be organized in an interactive format, focusing on practical aspects, novelties in the field, good investigative practices, relevant jurisprudence, as well as debates on the non-unitary judicial practice, including the analysis of arguments in support of the proposed solutions.

Target group: approx. 20 participants (prosecutors, police, judges and other professionals)

Trainers/seminar: 2 national experts and 1 international expert

II. <u>1 expert</u> for the development/revision of the integrated methodology for conducting investigations in drug trafficking cases (Output 2/Activity 2.1 - Intervention 2.1.2):

The activity consists in the participation to a workshop having the objective of establishing/reviewing the deliverable structure and distributing the tasks at the level of the drafting/reviewing team, as well as the actual development of the deliverable or the updated version.

The deliverable Integrated Methodology for Conducting Investigations in drug trafficking cases is a summary (max. 100 pages) of the main flow of investigative actions, including flowcharts/logical schemes, to be taken into account when handling crime files in the targeted area, with specific elements for the main crime groups in the scope of intervention. The deliverable will be a tool designed to be used by prosecutors and judicial police officers involved in criminal investigations in drug trafficking cases.

The expert for this activity will be selected from those candidates who also apply to activities **a**) **1 preparatory workshop** and **b**) **6 training sessions.**

3. Profile of experts. Procedural provisions

The experts who apply for the a) 1 Preparatory workshop and b) 6 training sessions may also apply for the II. Methodology activity. The expert for the development/ revision of of the integrated Methodology will be selected from those candidates applying to activities: a) 1 Preparatory workshop and b) 6 training sessions.

The selection of experts will be carried out by a selection panel appointed at PICCJ/INM level in two stages.

As a first eliminatory stage, the selection board will assess, on the basis of the documentation submitted, the admissibility of the applications with regard to the following requirements:

- a) compliance with the deadline for submission of applications;
- b) compliance with the registration documentation, namely:
 - a letter of motivation, including the post(s) for which the application is submitted;
 - curriculum vitae;
 - **for training sessions**: a seminar plan containing information on the training objectives, indications on all stages of the planning and organisation of the session, the training methods which the expert intends to use, and any other elements which the expert considers relevant in this context. The design of the seminar plan will take into account the specificity of the target group (20 prosecutors, policemen, judges and other professionals in the field concerned), the duration of the training activity (3 days of training/session, the duration of a seminar day being of maximum 8 hours), as well as the fact that during each session will participate a team of 3 experts (2 national and 1 international);
 - **for the methodology**: proposal for structure, including the composition of the drafting team (2 *national experts and 1 international expert*);
- c) At least 2 years of experience in the handling/handling of drug trafficking cases/files;
- d) knowledge of English (minimum level B1 or B2).

*Candidates may attach supporting documents: certificates, certificates, references/recommendation letters, any other documents, as the case may be, that can support the candidate's claims to meet the qualification requirements.

^{**}The selection board reserves the right to request, during the evaluation of the candidates, other documents attesting the fulfilment of the requirements.



Failure to comply with the deadline for submission of documents, the specific qualification requirements, as well as failure to submit all the required documents, according to the list indicated above, entails the inadmissibility of the application.

In the second stage, the committee will examine candidates in an **interview**, supported, where appropriate, including by modern means of distance communication, with a view to candidates meeting the criteria relating to:

- a) in-depth professional knowledge relevant to the field of expertise concerned;
- b) substantiated support of the points of view;
- c) didactic skills, by reference to the position concerned;
- d) the ability to communicate and relate in working with adults;
- e) relevant professional experience in the field concerned (in the assessment of this criterion will be taken into account, as appropriate, and published works, participation in training programs in the field / exchanges of experience);
- f) readiness to collaborate and integrate in the team of experts, including the availability of travel to the territory, as appropriate.

Only candidates with a **minimum grade of 8** will be selected in order of grades and within the limits of the available vacancies according to the selection notice.

The selection of experts will be made in descending order of the arithmetic average of the total scores awarded by each member of the selection board for each candidate.

Candidates who have obtained a minimum grade of 8 but for whom the selection proposal has not been made due to lack of available places will be placed on a reserve list.

Note: If two or more candidates obtain equal scores, their division to establish the final list of selected experts will be carried out giving priority, in the following order, to the candidate who:

- has a higher number of participations as an expert in similar projects, carried out in the field of expertise;
 - has a longer relevant professional experience in the required field of expertise;
- obtained a higher score on the criteria stipulated in the previous, letters c and d (teaching skills, respectively the ability to communicate and relate in working with adults).

4. Obligations of experts

Common obligations:

- maintain permanent contact with the designated activity manager at NMI/PICCJ level for any issues relating to the proper organisation of activities;
- use the format communicated by the designated activity manager at NMI/PICCJ level, containing the visibility elements of the financing mechanism, when drawing up the documents;
- to complete and submit the supporting documents related to the payment, in accordance with the provisions of the remuneration contract for the activity.

Specific obligations:

I. Preparatory workshop and 6 training sessions

- to participate in the workshop for the preparation of the planned training sessions, attended by representatives of the OCP-PICCJ and the NMI, in order to discuss all the organizational and substantive aspects necessary for the proper organization of the professional training



- activities, as described above, respectively for the elaboration of recommendations regarding the format of the integrated methodology for conducting investigations in drug trafficking cases/topics for 2 eLearning modules and 2 video tutorials in the field;
- to participate and collaborate with other experts to the development/definition of the methodology for carrying out the activities (e.g. introduction, objectives, format of activities, etc.), development of the agenda and of the materials supporting the debates/presentations;
- participate in and moderate the training activity to which one has been allocated, as well as give presentations according to the agenda, with a focus on practical aspects, taking into account the quality of the participants. The presence of the expert is mandatory throughout the day or seminar;

II. Developing/reviewing an integrated methodology for conducting investigations into drug trafficking cases

- participate in the workshop having the objective of establishing/reviewing the deliverable structure and distributing tasks among the drafting/review team;
- to develop the part allocated within the deliverable, including by implementing the recommendations communicated by the representatives of the NLI/PICCJ, in compliance with the deadlines set in the workshop, also taking into account the duration of the activity communicated by the PICCJ;
- work with the other members of the drafting team to complete the deliverable.

*The rights and obligations of the parties will be detailed in the contract for the remuneration of the activity that will be concluded after the conclusion of this selection procedure.

**Expert planning in training activities will be carried out in the workshop, depending on the results of the selection procedure.

5. Financial aspects

All financial benefits will be provided on the basis of the activity remuneration contract concluded between the expert and PICCJ, as Component Operator, as well as the National Institute of Magistracy, as component partner.

The selected experts will benefit from the following financial entitlements:

- I. Participation in training workshops: fee: 350 CHF x 6 days of activity/expert, (2 days of workshop participation and 4 days of material development); Perdiem: CHF 222 x 2 days perdiem (accommodation, meals, local transport and unforeseen expenses); transport: 800 CHF round-trip flight x 2 experts
- II. Participation in training sessions: fee: 515 CHF/day seminar/expert; Perdiem: CHF 222 x 3 days perdiem/seminar (accommodation, meals, local transport and unforeseen expenses); transport: 800 CHF round-trip/seminar flight x 1 expert
- III. Developing/reviewing the integrated methodology for conducting investigations in drug trafficking cases, including participation in the workshop: fee: 350 CHF x 14 days of activity/expert, (2 days workshop participation and 12 days deliverable development); Perdiem: CHF 222 x 2 days perdiem (accommodation, meals, local transport and unforeseen expenses); transport: 800 CHF round-trip flight

^{*}The amount of fees per day of activity includes taxes and contributions due to the state budget by the employee/employer. Based on the documents submitted by the expert, double taxation will be avoided.



Payment of fees/perdiem and transport will be made after completion of the activity (preparatory workshop/seminar/workshop on methodology), as well as after submission of the following documents:

- (i) payment request;
- (ii) supporting documents (e.g. flight invoice/proof of payment/boarding pass)
- (iii) a brief report on the work carried out (e.g. for seminars: the topic addressed, identified non-uniform practice issues; for the methodology: brief description of the conclusions of the workshop and the written material).

The forms of these documents will be made available to the expert by the PICCJ/National Institute of Magistracy.

6. Intellectual property rights

The intellectual property right over all materials and documents developed in the context of the implementation of the activities, including paper or electronic format, as well as over any results provided by the financing contract are and remain the exclusive property of the Component Operator.

They are subject to the right of ownership, including, but not limited to, copyright and/or any other intellectual property rights, obtained in the implementation or as a result of the implementation of the aforementioned sessions.

7. Final provisions and contact details

The processing of personal data is carried out for the purposes of this selection procedure, by publication on the websites of the Prosecutor's Office attached to the High Court of Cassation and Justice and the National Institute of Magistracy.

The collection and processing of the requested personal data is carried out in compliance with the legislation in force on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and the free movement of such data.
